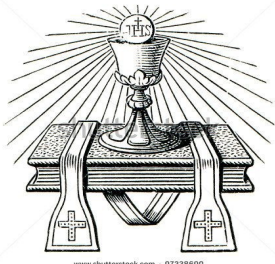

Visit of the Relics of Saint Anthony of Padua:

Two holy relics of Saint Anthony of Padua will visit the diocese during November. Father Alex Ratti, a friar from the Basilica in Padua, will bring two first-class relics of the beloved Saint Anthony of Padua to Nova Scotia. One reliquary contains layers of skin of Saint Anthony's cheek and the 2nd reliquary contains a fragment of the Saint's Floating Ribs. The Floating Rib relic has special meaning because it was received in the Cathedral of Buenos Aires by the then-Archbishop of Jorge Maria Bergoglio (now Pope Francis) in the year 2000. This same relic was also venerated by Sister Lucia of Fatima in her convent in Coimbra, Portugal, in 1995, for the 800th anniversary of Saint Anthony's birth. **Friday, November 9**
